





September 2021 to From February 2022, the Hamilton County Quick Response Team received 865 inbound referrals. That's compared to a total of 946 referrals received from April 2018 through August 2021. More than half, 58% (or 549 individuals), successfully contacted by the QRT have been referred or connected to recovery support services.

Since 2015 Colerain Township, QRT has conducted over 620 follow-ups. Approximately 434 of those individuals were reached and assessed. Of those, nearly 66% have been engaged in treatment! Repeat overdose rate was 22% in 2016. This effort has resulted in a 4% rate for 2021 and a 58% reduction in OD responses since our peak in 2017.
