Hamilton County Public Health joined the Hamilton County Administration, the Board of County Commissioners and 14 local businesses for the first ever official signing day to join the Recovery Friendly Hamilton County Initiative (RFHC).

RFHC began with a vision at Hamilton County Public Health (HCPH) for equipping local employers with the tools and resources they need to address SUD among their personnel. It is estimated that over 75% of Americans with an SUD are part of the workforce. The human and economic toll of addiction is far too great to go unchecked in the workplace.

RFHC wants to enable Hamilton County workplaces to espouse advantageous recovery-friendly practices, recruit quality candidates, and retain valuable workers through a collaborative, no cost partnership.
